

In 2011 Exmoor National Park became the first area in Europe to be designated as a Dark Sky Reserve by Dark Sky International. The whole of Exmoor can boast incredibly dark skies and the designation specifically helps us to protect the quality of the night skies.

Exmoor National Park has some of the Darkest Skies in England and it is vitally important that we continue to protect the night. Artificial light not only has implications for our health and well-being, it also disrupts wildlife's natural patterns and limits our views of the stunning starry skies.

We are inviting children (aged 11 and under) to create their own **Dark Skies Protector** - a character that travels the skies to ensure light pollution is kept to a minimum and the stars remain bright.

The overall winner will receive a **CELESTRON** telescope. Our judges will be looking for more than just a creative design - they'll also consider your protector's name, any special powers it possesses, where it lives, and whether there are any stories or legends surrounding it.


